Vote on proposed change to the By-Laws at stated meeting Wednesday September 20, 2017

ARTICLE V

Initiation Fees, Dues, Per Capita, Hospital Levy Section 5.1 Initiation Fee The initiation fee shall be determined at a stated or special meeting of the temple after notice has been given to each member stating the proposed amount of the initiation fee. It must be paid in full prior to initiation.

At this time the Fee for Initiation is \$100.00, but does not appear in the By Laws.

We ask that the Initiation Fee be raised to \$150.00.

The reason for the increase is to provide every new Noble with a Felt Embroidered Cyprus Fez at his initiation. If passed there would be a subsection that reads:

(a) The initiation Fee is \$150.00.

2017 Walking for Children Update

Day 1: Set out at 5:05 am from Adonai Lodge #718 in Highland, NY. Proceeded to walk for 14 hr and 40 min and reached the site of the Catskill Lodge in Athens after doing a total of 41 miles where I promptly collapsed on the concrete slab where the Lodge used to be. The temperature reached 95 which made my first day much more pleasant. That night there was an incredible thunderstorm and several times I heard the sizzle of the air as it was ionized just prior to the lightning bolts. The door flap of my tent was open and I got soaked.

Day 2: Set out at 5:15 am and reached the Cyprus Shrine Center at 2:30 pm after 27 miles. That evening there was a BBQ in my honor and a good time was had by all. Spent the night at the Days Inn where I thoroughly enjoyed a hot shower and a soft (and dry) bed.

Day 3: Spent the day heading east on Route 20. Passing through Nassau I noticed that the left wheel of my "rig" was wobbling badly. After a 10 hr and 20 min 32 mile stroll, I reached New Lebanon where I set up my tent in the woods.

Day 4: I tackled the Berkshires. My day began with a 3 mile hike of UP heading towards Pittsfield. I continued on 20 to Beckett and did a total of 28 miles in 10 ½ hours. I stayed at a friends house that night.

Day 5: Started another day with 3 miles of UP which brought me to the top of Jacobs Ladder on 20. After that it was downhill for the most part to Springfield. It was a cold and rainy day and I reached Westfield after 28 miles and about 10 hours. I was picked up by a fellow Noble from the Melha Shrine and spent the night at his house in Agawam. They had a group of Nobles and Ladies over and had a BBQ in my honor.

Day 6: I began the days walk around 7 am and reached the Springfield Hospital at 9:23 am (I was told I was 7 minutes early) where I was greeted by a members of the hospital staff and quite a few Nobles from Melha. I spent about an hour at the hospital before setting out again. I left the stroller with two friends who were going to try to get the wheel fixed (it was in bad shape) and



continued east. I missed one turn in Springfield and proceeded to take the scenic route through Ludlow. I was lucky. The roads I ended up on pretty much ran parallel to 20 and I only added about 2 miles to my day. I did a total of 28 miles in 8 ½ hours. That evening I was picked up just east of Palmer and brought to another friends house in Wilbraham. While there, my friend from Agawam and his wife came by. He asked if I was ready to fix the wheel. I reluctantly got up (I was feeling a little beat) and followed him to the garage where I was presented with another stroller. Mine was not repairable and he got me a replacement (I truly belong to the greatest fraternity!).

Day 7: My friend returned me to the point where he picked me up and I headed east with my new "rig". This was another long day of left foot, right foot, repeat. I was on the road for 12 hours and covered 35 miles. I made it to Shrewsbury where I spent the night hiding in my tent in the woods.



Day 8: The day started out dry but that only lasted for 2 hours. Then it was almost 10 hours in the rain as I made my way to Belmont where I stayed with a women who I went to elementary school with. I did 34 miles and was delighted when I reached her house. After a nice warm shower and set of dry clothes, I was spent the evening with my friend and her husband reminiscing.

Day 9: This day started in the rain but only for an hour or so. I missed a turn along the way and asked people how to get to downtown Boston from there (I was at Harvard). You would think that they would have been able to answer such an easy question. Thanks to the directions I received, my 8 mile final leg turned into 12 miles but I did reach the Boston hospital at noon (right on time) where I was met by members of the hospital staff and a few patients.

In total, this years Walk was 265 miles and took me 8 ½ days (90 hr 10 min of walking) to complete. I spent 3 nights in my tent, 1 in a hotel, and 4 with friends. We raised almost \$8000, half of which is going to the Springfield hospitals new Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit and the rest to the Cyprus Transportation Fund and the hospitals in Boston and Philadelphia.
